

Born Arthur Costa, in 1990, in rural Portugal, Mr. Costa's art allowed him to leave him curious, courageous and strong near hometown spirit of Viseu. Through colors and material exploration, Mr. Costa's art interrogate rules, social ideas, and the evolution of communication, all with meticulous detail and total openness. Mr. Costa consistently pushes the limits of right, of what is acceptable, breaking taboos and conventions tearing, fluidly combining sculptural and sentimental. With the technique of playing with balloons, he took the ephemeral form of balloons and express everyday occurrences and inspirations, thus creating a metaphor for the complexity and interconnectedness of our bodies and our psychological processes. Mr. Costa's bursts of bright colors often mask political and cultural critiques woven into the different materials of installations, mirroring her respect for the cultural world. He highlights that which already exists in real time, in our environment making the ordinary into something new.

As an active supporter of human rights, sexual equality, and freedom of expression, Mr. Costa has used the broad appeal of her work to display her solidarity with those stifled by oppressive laws. Through her body of work, Mr. Costa has always sought to bring color and life, energy, and always surprise with new proposals. Mr. Costa's work has been exhibited in some galleries, and on public spaces. At this time, Mr. Costa searching that their work reach more people and collaborate with galleries.

Mr Costa currently lives and works in Sintra, Lisbon.
